2022 Annual Show Cattle (Beef and Dairy Breeds) Entry Requirements

THE RULES



- 1. Entries Close online on the 3rd October 2023 and must be received by this date. The Wairarapa Agricultural and Pastoral Show (Wairarapa A&P Show) Secretary will permit NO late entries or substitute entries, to ensure full compliance with the Wairarapa A&P Society's show Biosecurity Plan.
- 2. The term "Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary" means the respective Beef and Dairy section stewards, as applicable, in this document, who are the delegated cattle management authorities for the Wairarapa A&P Show Committee.
- 3. All animals entered must be named on the entry form along with the RFID Nait number of each individual animal (Instructions on how to find each animals RFID number at the end of the rules).
- 4. In accordance with the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (RAS) codes, all entries must be registered with a RAS affiliated Society or if under 12 months of age be eligible for registration, with the exception of Future Beef type classes and or local classes
- 5. Entries are submitted to the rules and regulations of the Wairarapa A&P Society, copies are available from the Show Secretary.
- 6. The Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary reserves the right to combine judging classes if insufficient entries are received.
- 7. All entry fees are GST inclusive. A GST tax invoice can be supplied on request from the show secretary.
- 8. Entry Tickets will be sent to exhibitors.
- 9. Prize money TBC
- 10. All animals are to be marshalled on site at the Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary's discretion. The Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary will schedule and manage access to the animal Bio-Security Wash Bay facilities. The Wairarapa A&P Show secretary will discuss Bio-Security arrangements with exhibitors and agree the Bio-Security protocols once entries have been submitted and accepted by the Show Secretary
- 11. Exhibitors must display, on each animal entered, an operable Nait approved Radio Frequency Identification Display (RFID) tag, necessary to obtain entry to the Wairarapa A&P Show site. Exhibitors agree that they will ensure they comply with Ministry of Primary Industries Animal Handling codes, Nait, and the Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary's directives at all times during the Wairarapa A&P Show.
- 12. Every and any objection or protest must be made in writing within one hour of judging of each class, and signed by the person making the objection(s) and delivered to the Show Secretary along with the sum of \$50 which shall be forfeited to the Society should the objection be considered frivolous,



- vexatious, dishonest, misleading or incomplete, following appropriate investigation by the Secretary in consultation with approved Judges. The Show Secretary's decision is final.
- 13. All Bulls two years and over must have two leaders from the nose ring and be under competent supervision.
- 14. All heifers / cow 12 months and over must have a nose clip.
- 15. All animals are to be under competent supervision at all times.
- 16. All Bulls must be securely tied in the stalls by an adequate chain around the neck or a stout leather collar with adequate rope attached, as well as a halter, to the satisfaction of the Show Secretary.
- 17. Please bring your own water feeders for your cattle. There are no common troughs available.
- 18. All electrical equipment to have a current electrical compliance safety tag fitted.
- 19. The Hicks family Pavilion loading ramps are off limits to cattle at all times.
- 20. All cattle must be entered in the name of the Nait registered Owner.
- 21. **All** Animals must be named on entry form with **individual Nait RFID number** including pairs or group classes.
- 22. Animal Cruelty is NOT acceptable in any way including but not limited to excessive handling or medical manipulation.
- 23. All animals must be free of parasites and be in sound healthy condition.
- 24. Cattle may be entered in either Beef or Lifestyle classes but not both. Cattle entered in FB classes on Saturday (classes 6218 6225) are not eligible for Beef or Lifestyle Classes on Sunday
- 25. Highland Cattle entering Beef classes must provide a Highland Passport.

Show Age Group Classing for Beef / Lifestyle Cattle

- Age of Cattle to be calculated at 1st June 2023
- Any Bull born prior to 1st June 2021 must enter the "Bull 2-year-old and over" class.
- Females born prior to 1st June 2020 must enter the "Senior Cow 3-year-old and over" class.
- Females born between 1st June 2020 and 1st June 2021 must enter the "2-year-old" class.
- Animals born between 1st June 2022 and 1st June 2023 must enter "Yearling" classes.
- Animals born after 1st June 2023 must enter "Calf" are only eligible to enter "Calf" classes.
- Any Bull 12 months of age and over must have and use a nose ring fitted for handling.

Show Age Group Classing for Future Beef Type classes.

- Heifer or Steer 12 months and under
- Heifer or Steer 13 months and over



Nait Compliance Definition and Requirements

All stock must be NAIT registered and in accordance with OSPRI and TBfree New Zealand. Regardless of age they must be

- Departing from a property that is registered with a NAIT number and TBfree NZ herd number accompanied with a copy of a valid Animal Status Declaration form.
- Fitted with a valid NAIT RFID tag and registered in the NAIT system.
- Registered in a movement to the event NAIT number (454124) from the animal's current NAIT number no later than Friday 28th October. Please bring a copy of your Nait transfer with you.
- Registered in a return movement from the event NAIT number to their destination (receiving NAIT number) within 48 hours of departure.
- All stock over 90 days of age travelling from within a TBfree Movement Control Area must be premovement tested within 60 days of arriving at the event.
- All TBfree forms and Nait transfers will be collected upon arrival and animals Nait tag will be Scanned (Please do not unload your animals from transport until a Steward has directed you to do so).
- In accordance with MPI regulations the Wairarapa A&P Show operates a policy of No Nait, No Show, No exceptions
- ALL ANIMALS ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE OWNER



Biosecurity and Wairarapa A&P Show Practice Policy

Wairarapa A&P Society take Biosecurity very seriously so we require our competitors to please adhere to the following rules

- One stud only at a time per washbay as per the time slot provided (Dairy and beef have separate washbays).
- No new Cattle exhibitor can be stalled in a pen previously used by another stud exhibitor, unless all bedding has been removed and replaced with fresh bedding with all rails and flooring disinfected (Fully sprayed wet) with Virkon disinfectant.
- Unless an animal is either at the wash bay, in the ring or moving between, all animals must be kept within their stalling area
- Please do not share buckets, troughs, brushes, grooming equipment, Nose clips etc with other exhibitors
- Please ensure you have the sufficient number of handlers for your animals, for bio-security reasons swapping handlers between studs is not permitted at this event unless organised with the show secretary prior to entries closing
- There will be Hand Sanitizer provided in the pavilion
- We will be running a public display on Saturday and Showing on Sunday for the Beef / Lifestyle classes. FB youth classes will be showing on Saturday. If you are requiring extra people to attend to set up or assist you, please ensure they are fully compliant with the above Bio-Security rules
- In the interest of Bio-security a "keep left" and "giveaway" to the right approach will be taken for animals entering and exiting the stalls and using raceways. A 2-meter gap between exhibitor stalls must be adhered to at all times to the satisfaction of the Stewards.
- Any exhibitor that has cattle that require milking will need to provide their own milking system.
- All exhibitors are responsible for keeping their stalls clean and tidy at all times, including poo removal.
- All electrical equipment to have a current electrical compliance safety tag fitted.
- There is a NO SMOKING / NO VAPING policy in the Cattle Pavilion it the responsibility of all to remind the general public of this.




If you are wanting to <u>display only</u> (with or without) animals please contact Lisa ASAP as space for these is limited - first in first served



To find EACH individual animals RFID number you must already have the animal registered in the NAIT system. You then need to log on to your NAIT and click on "registered animals" as below



The RFID number is then showing in the second column as below and is individual to each animal. Please ensure you have the correct one.

- **6204** Heifer Calf (Born on or after 1st June 2022)

Champion & Reserve Champion Female

To be judged from winners of classes 6201, 6202, 6203 & 6204 (Champion prize \$50)

- 6205 Bull 2 years and over (Born before the 1st of June 2020) Must have 2 leaders from the nose ring
- 6206 Bull Yearling (Born on or after 1st June 2021)
- 6207 Bull Calf (Born on or after 1st June 2022)

Champion & Reserve Champion Male

To be judged from winners of classes 6205, 6206 & 6207. (Champion prize \$50)

Wairarapa A&P Meat and Wool Cup

The best placed animal to represent each breed.

At Judges discretion breeds may be invited from lifestyle classes
